* A note about the score: My apologies for the number of accidentals that accompany the score from here on to the end. With so many key changes driving the number through many dramatic scenes, it is difficult (impossible!) to always determine a tonal center that can accommodate the small twists that make the music interesting. So, occasionally I have opted to substitute alternate notation (accidentals) even within a particular key signature in order to visually facilitate somewhat easier (and more memorable) reading for the pianist and that more accurately reflects the momentary vagaries of any particular chord within a measure.
