GR: Flute Celeste 8', Gamba 8', Open Flute 4', SW + CH to GR
SW: Rohrflute 8', Viola di Gamba 8', Vox Celeste 8', Orchestral Strings 8'
CH: Gedackt 8', Erzaehler + Celeste 8', Rohrflute 4'
Ped: Subbass 16', Lieblich Gedackt 16', Gedackt 8', Vop;pme 8', SW to Ped 8'

Mea. 1—19 = GR should be featured; SW and CH ± keep boxes mostly closed
Mea. 20—26 = gradually open all boxes to full

Mea. 27—end = gradually close boxes to pp; from mea. 32, emphasize SW and
gradually close GR and CH completely.

Mea. 36-37-38 = swell expression and then decresc. to fine.
